

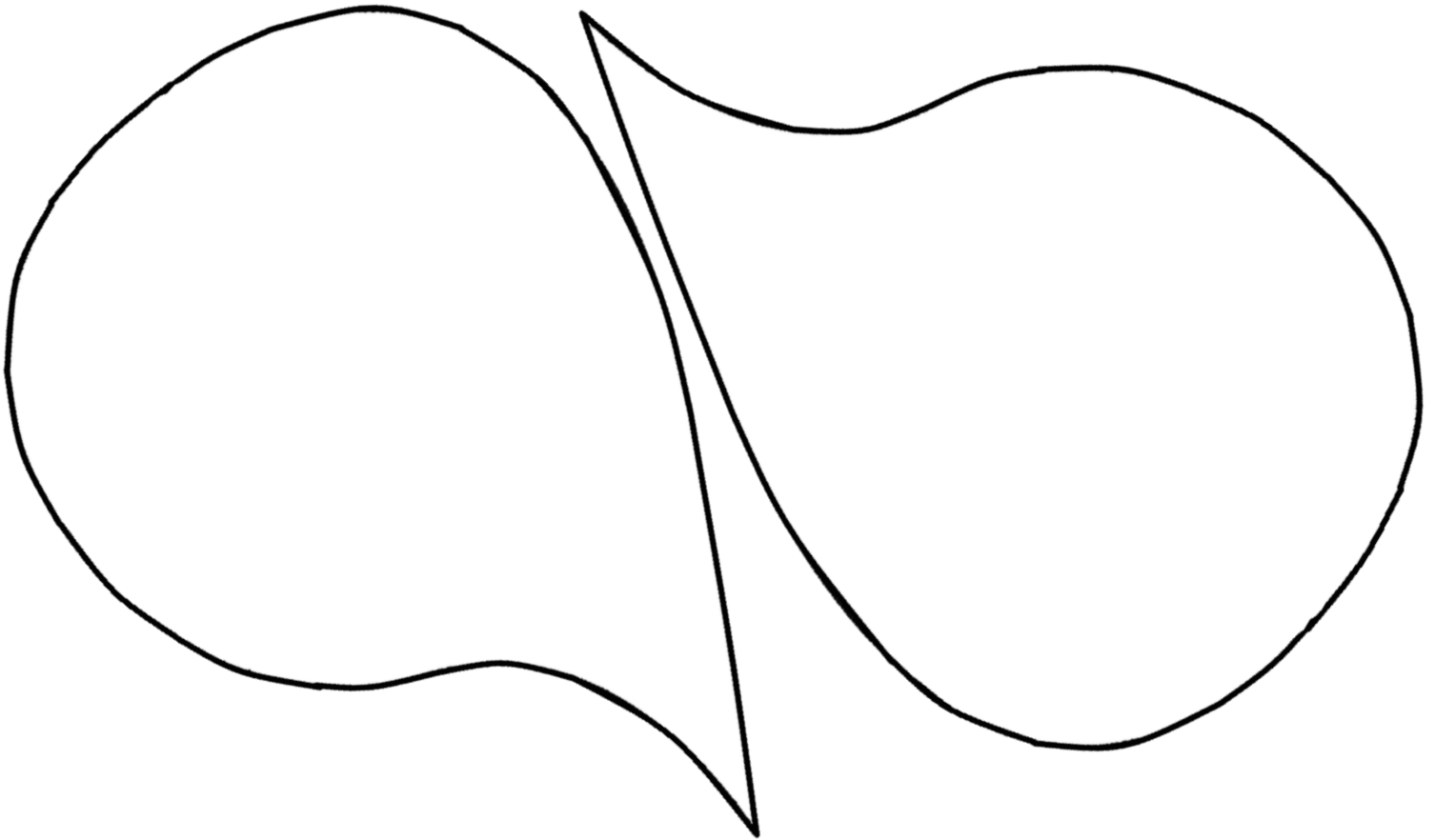
DPL SIMILES & METAPHORS

Similes and Metaphors use words to compare things. A simile will use words “like” or “as”, while a metaphor will not. For example, “I’m as hungry as an ox” is a simile and “he has a heart of gold” is a metaphor. Some well known similes from the *Alice* books are “grin like a Cheshire cat” and “mad as a March Hare”.
