REMEMBER: If no one submits their pics there won't be anything to vote on!



ARCHERY WITH ARTEMIS

Artemis is the Greek goddess of the hunt, sometimes referred to as "The Huntress" or "Maiden of the Silver Bow". One of her symbols is the bow and quiver. In many of the Greek myths, she hunts wild animals.

Using the bow and arrows provided, practice your own skills at archery – miniature style. Color your bow and the Minotaur. Set your Minotaur "target" up on a flat surface and see if you can hit him with your arrows!



FACTS ABOUT ARTEMIS

- Ⓒ Artemis was daughter of Zeus and Leto and twin sister of Apollo.
- Ⓒ She was primarily a huntress, goddess of wildlife and patroness of hunters.
- Ⓒ The bear was sacred to her.
- Ⓒ She was sometimes associated with the goddess of the moon.
- Ⓒ A temple built in her honor at Ephesus (now part of Turkey) became one of the "Seven Wonders of the Ancient World."
- Ⓒ Homer referred to her as a mistress of wild animals.
- Ⓒ In art, she is often accompanied by a stag or hunting dog.
