

14 Tips for Getting the Most Out of Libby

[Libby](#) has been designed to ensure that readers of all technological skill levels can quickly and easily start reading or listening to digital books instantly. Whether you're a pro or a complete novice, Libby has been developed to be simple and easy. That doesn't mean there aren't lots of fun features to discover within the app, however.

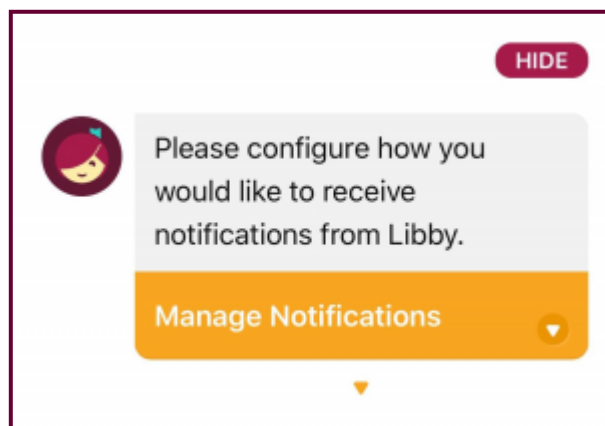
Here are 14 tips that will ensure you'll become a power user of Libby in no time.

1. Let Libby give you notifications

Libby now uses [push notifications](#) to offer alerts about your books. Users can choose which notifications they'd like to receive from the Libby menu under **Manage Notifications**, including:

- When a hold becomes available
- When a loan is about to expire
- When a loan has expired
- And more

You never have to worry about missing a hold or worrying about when a digital book is going to expire again.

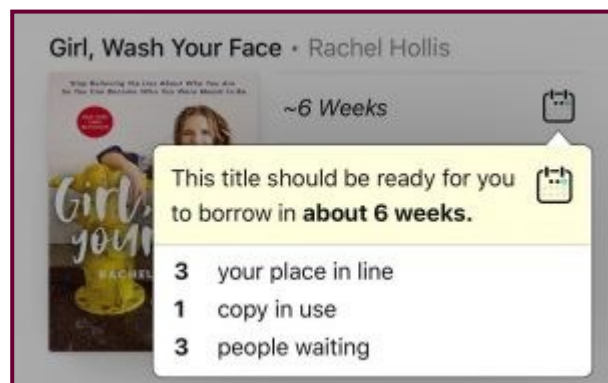


2. Adjust the playback speed

To change the playback speed in an audiobook, tap the odometer icon at the top of your screen. Then, choose a preset or drag on the "Fine-tune" slider to set a custom speed (0.6–3x).

3. See your audiobook progress

You can see your current position, your progress as a percentage, and the remaining time in the audiobook at the top of the player. You can see your progress in the current chapter next to the "Chapters" button (or chapter name). The time elapsed is on the left, and the time remaining is on the right. If you tap the jacket cover, it will show you an estimate of when you'll finish the title based on your current pace.



4. See your place in line for a hold

After you place a hold, go to *Shelf > Holds* and tap the calendar icon to see your place in line. You'll also see your approximate wait time, the number of copies in use, and the number of people waiting.

5. Share what you're reading

Libby now lets you [share](#) what you're reading with your friends using the **Share** button found in a

11. Suspend your holds

Suspending a hold lets you move up a title's wait list without the title becoming available for you. If you reach #1 in line, you'll be in the first position to get the book once your suspension ends.

You may want to suspend a hold if you have too little time to read or too many books in progress.

To suspend all your holds:

1. Go to *Shelf > Holds > Actions > Suspend All Holds*.
2. Use the slider to choose how long you'd like to suspend your holds. **Tip:** *When you drag the slider to the right edge, tap the underlined **180 days** for more options.*
3. Tap **Update Holds**.

To suspend a single hold:

1. Go to *Shelf > Holds*.
2. Tap **Manage Hold**, then **Suspend Hold**.
3. Use the slider to choose how long you'd like to suspend your hold. **Tip:** *When you drag the slider to the right edge, tap the underlined **180 days** for more options.*
4. Tap **Update Hold**.

12. Return a book early

If you finish a book early, you can return it before its due date using the steps below:

1. Go to *Shelf > Loans*.
2. Tap **Manage Loan**.
3. If you've borrowed the book from multiple libraries, select the **due date** for the copy you'd like to return.
4. Tap **Return Early**, then **Return**.

13. Add multiple libraries

If you have library cards at multiple libraries, you can add each of them by tapping the Libby face icon in the top right of your screen and tapping **Add A Library**. Search for the library you want to add, and when you find it select **Add A Library Card** to save your card information for that library.

14. Change your language

Libby automatically uses the language your device or web browser is set to, as long as the language is supported in the app. If you'd like to use Libby in a different language than your device, tap the Libby face icon and then *> Get Some Help > Choose Your Language* (under "Common Solutions").
