<p>1 Writing</p> <p>It's Author's Day. Draw scenes from your child's favorite book together and mail them to the author.</p>	<p>2 Math</p> <p>Pour out a small portion of your child's favorite cereal and ask her to count how many pieces are in the bowl.</p>	<p>3 Science</p> <p>It's Sandwich Day. Show your child how to make his favorite sandwich and ask him why healthy food is important.</p>	<p>4 Sounds</p> <p>Create an original turkey gobble with your child.</p>	<p>5 Reading</p> <p>Read <i>I Spy Thanksgiving</i> by Holiday Kiddo Publishing. Ask your child to point out decorations in the book that you have at home.</p>	<p>6 Play</p> <p>It's Play Outside Day. Head to the nearest playground and use the equipment to set the stage for an imaginative game.</p>
<p>7 Rhymes</p> <p>Think of words that rhyme with "thank" and take turns saying something you're thankful for.</p>	<p>8 Math</p> <p>It's National STEM/STEAM Day. Ask your child to make simple shapes out of building bricks.</p>	<p>9 Stories</p> <p>It's Career Development Month. Ask your child to tell a story about what she wants to be when she grows up.</p>	<p>10 Reading</p> <p>After reading your child's favorite book, ask him to explain the main conflict.</p>	<p>11 Science</p> <p>Empty a tray of ice cubes into a pot on the stove and explain why they transform into water and steam when heated up.</p>	<p>12 Songs</p> <p>It's World Kindness Day. Help your child create a simple song about the importance of being kind.</p>
<p>14 Sounds</p> <p>Put different amounts of water into each of three glasses. Have your child gently tap them with a fork and ask him why the sound changes.</p>	<p>15 Rhymes</p> <p>Have fun making up new words that rhyme with cranberry. Keep "cran" and replace berry - "like saying cran-dairy".</p>	<p>16 Science</p> <p>Look at the clouds and ask your child what shapes he sees.</p>	<p>17 Songs</p> <p>Help your child write a song about her favorite Thanksgiving meal.</p>	<p>18 Stories</p> <p>It's Princess Day. Ask your child to tell an original story about his favorite princess.</p>	<p>20 Writing</p> <p>It's Military Family Month. Ask your child to draw a picture thanking a service member.</p>
<p>21 Reading</p> <p>It's Inspirational Role Models Month. Read a book about a heroic historical figure and ask your child why people look up to them.</p>	<p>22 Rhymes</p> <p>Ask your child to identify the color of different Thanksgiving dishes and rhyme another word with that color.</p>	<p>23 Math</p> <p>Go to the grocery store and have your child count how many cans of food you put in the cart.</p>	<p>24 Songs</p> <p>It's Jukebox Day. Listen to <i>Rock Around the Clock</i> by Bill Haley & His Comets and have fun dancing around together.</p>	<p>25 Writing</p> <p>It's Thanksgiving Day! Ask your child to draw a picture of everything she's thankful for.</p>	<p>26 Reading</p> <p>Head to the nearest bookstore and ask your child to pick out a new book.</p>
<p>28 Play</p> <p>Create art with your child using Thanksgiving leftovers. Take a picture of your plates and then eat the meal together.</p>	<p>29 Science</p> <p>It's Cyber Monday. Find a kid-friendly video, website, or game that explains how shopping and shipping works.</p>	<p>30 Songs</p> <p>Sing holiday favorites together.</p>	<p>Help your child get ready to learn to read!</p> <p>Each day features a fun activity that will help your child build pre-reading skills.
